Year 3 delved into the past this term to learn all about the history of our village.

The children discovered that Sacriston was named after 'Sacristan' monks from Durham Cathedral who set up a farmhouse in the Sacriston area.

They also discovered that the village grew to be much bigger between the 1860s and 1970s, as more people moved here to work in the colliery before it declined and closed in 1985.

The children thought of their

own questions that they have about the history of their local area, including:

"How many people worked in the mine together?" - Charlotte.

"How many houses were built for the miners?" - Ellie

"Who created the tiger graffiti in our area next to the school?" - Thomas



How far does food travel?

Year 5 welcomed Nick the chef into school this term to help with their DT project 'Eat the seasons'.

The project saw pupils learn how to peel, dice, chop and grate vegetables. They learnt where food comes from, why it is better to purchase foods locally and how travel miles can contribute to global warming. The children then created and enjoyed a soup made from the vegetables that they had prepared collectively.
