Literacy



This week in literacy we are going to plan and write our own story about a pirate. It is completely up to you what happens in your story as long as it has 4 parts: the beginning, a problem, a solution and an ending.



Lesson 1 (Monday live lesson) – Planning the characters and setting of your story

Lesson 2 (Tuesday live lesson)— planning the 4 parts of your story

Lesson 3 – Writing the beginning and problem parts of your story.

Using your plan from the two live lessons on Monday and Tuesday, begin to write your story. Take your time to focus on the beginning where you will introduce your main character and say where the setting is. Remember to use lots of adjectives to make your writing interesting – I've never seen your pirate or their ship before so you need to describe it to me. After you have finished the beginning you need to write the problem part of your story. Remember to write in detail what problem your pirate faces.

Lesson 4 – Writing the solution and ending of your story

Read the beginning and problem part of your story that you wrote yesterday to remind yourself where you were up to. Continue with your story by writing the solution part of the story where your pirate's problem will be solved. After that, write the ending of your story.

Lesson 5 – Edit and improve your story.

Read your finished story. Take a look for things that you think you could add it to make it even better. Once you are happy with your story, read it aloud to somebody in your house. I would love to hear it too so why not ask your adult to record you reading it and upload it onto your portfolio for me!

Extra activity -

Design a front cover for your story as if it was a real book! Make sure it looks good so that people would want to read your story.
