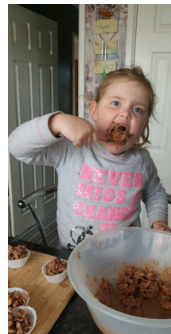


Bonjour Year 1,

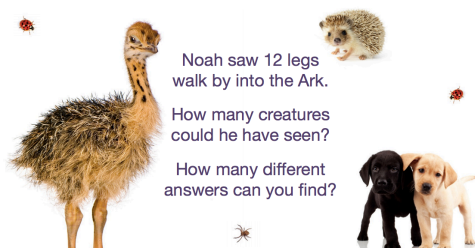
Day 1: Add by making 10

This is going to be fantastic!

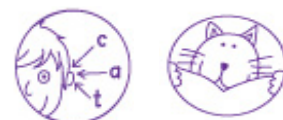
Day 3: Write your setting description using the adjectives from your plan.



Day 2: Plan a setting description for your Sacristo-nory story. Where does the story take place? A house, a forest, the beach...? What adjectives best describe your setting? Think about your senses; what can you see, hear, touch, smell? Make a spider diagram for adjectives you may want to include. Examples: towering trees, chirping birds, beaming sunshine

Day 4: Using the word 'and' to join sentences when describing. You will have to go back and watch Bitesize Daily on Tuesday for this activity. After you have completed this, see if you can up-level your work from yesterday by joining your sentences using the word 'and'. Remember to check it makes sense!

Day 5: Draw a picture to go with your setting description. You can complete this on Purple Mash if you like!
