






Activity 3

Design and Technology



The Anglo-Saxons created beautiful, highly intricate jewellery, such as beaded necklaces, pendants, rings, brooches and other items, in gold, silver, bronze and copper. Thread your charms onto a cord along with other materials, such as glass, wood, shell or bone beads, to create a personalised necklace. Select from and use appropriate tools to make your charms.
