Reception Compare the Dinosaurs

Now that Reception have started their learning about dinosaurs, they have started looking at how they are the same and different. The children had excellent ideas when they compared them:

Kings and Queens of Year 1

This week Year 1 learned about Queen Elizabeth II in their final history lesson on Childhood in the 1950s. The class learned about her coronation in 1953 by looking at images and watching video footage. Everyone loved seeing all the special parts of the ceremony, including the grand golden carriage, the oil blessed by God and the long heavy robes that the Queen wore, which had to be carried by 6 people! Year 1 had a great time learning about Queen Elizabeth II and making crowns like hers, and she might make another appearance in our new topic Bright Lights, Big City....

Year 2 Jack and the Beanstalk

Year 2 have been sequencing the story of Jack and the Beanstalk by working as a team to put a picture of each part of the story in chronological order. They demonstrated logic and problem-solving skills, as well as teamwork and an excellent understanding of the story.







Year 3 Multi Skills Festival Trip

This week year 3 had a fantastic time on their multi skills festival sports trip. They played a variety of dodgeball games practising their throwing and catching skills. They played against each other and against other schools for friendly competition. They then learned a dance and perfected their moves for performance. Year 4 Explore the 'States of Matter'

This week, Year 4 have enjoyed exploring their new topics for this term. In Science, we have started to explore 'States of Matter' and how materials can be grouped into solids, liquids and gases. We explored what the particles of each group look like and showed this in groups by pretending to be the particles ourselves. We then showed fantastic teamwork and categorised different objects in groups of solids, liquids and gases.







Year 5 Piece of Mind

This week, Year 5 had a visit from Eve from the Piece of Mind Team, focusing on friendships. We were introduced to characters who were having friendship troubles and discussed what they could do. We learnt the strategy of belly breathing and created our own self-soothe ideas to help us calm down in certain situations.



Year 6 'Our Changing World'

This week, Year 6 have started their new geography topic named 'Our Changing World'. Within the topic, the children will be exploring all about time zones, longitude and latitude, grid references and contour lines. This week, we focused on time zones and learnt that the Prime Meridian is the starting point for all the other meridians, and it runs through Greenwich, London. We explored what meridians are, how many the world is split into and how many degrees apart each meridian is. After that, we calculated different time zones around the world.
