Maths



This week we will be exploring 2D and 3D shapes using The National Oak Academy:

<u>Day 1: Sorting 2D shapes</u> Look at 2D shame names and sort them by their properties. Go on a 2D shape hunt either in your home or on your walk.

Day 2: Creating patterns with shapes Make and spot repeating patterns with 2D shapes. Draw or use natural resources to create your own.



<u>Day 3: Finding 3D shapes in the environment</u> Learn the names of simple 3D shapes. Can you find any out and about or in your home?

Day 4: Describing 3D shapes Look at the properties of 3D shapes and talk about them, using new language to describe them.

Day 5: Revision and practise A look back on some of the concepts covered so far with home learning.

Reading and Writing



It would be a good idea to check the sounds your child has retained now in phonics. There are slideshows on the Oxford Owl website for you to use for this, with the sounds in the order they are learned. We will be using Talk for Writing over the next few weeks, based on 'The Amazing Adventures of Max'. Max is a dog that loves adventures and in this story he ends up on a beach. Perfect for our topic this

<u>Day 1: Read or listen to Max's</u> story (Page 4-5) Talk about the story after and consider some questions.

<u>Day 2: Order the story (Page 6)</u> Oh dear, Max's pictures from the middle of his adventure have got muddled up. Can you work out the order they should be in?

<u>Day 3: Getting events in the right order</u> (<u>Page 7</u>) The pictures were all from the middle of the story, look back at the beginning of it, can you act that part out?


<u>Day 4: Beginning and ending (Page 8)</u> As there are only pictures from the middle of the story, can you draw some for the beginning and end too? Try labelling them with key words from each part.

<u>Day 5: Telling and inventing stories (Page 9)</u> Do you or a friend have a dog? Tell or make up your own adventure with a dog. What was the funniest thing that happened? Was there anything scary?



Science





Magic dancing milk!

Experiment to find out how different substances react to each other. You will need: A tray/dish, food colouring, milk (full fat best for this), soap and cocktail sticks/a fork.

- 1. Pour milk to cover the bottom of the tray/dish (milk needs to be at room temperature)
- 2. Add a few blobs of food colouring
- 3. Put some soap on the end of your stick or fork and dip it in
- 4. Watch the colours dance

Discuss why and how this might have happened?

You can see what it looks like now by using the webcam we looked at in R.E.


