#### **IMPORTANT STATEMENT FROM MRS PARKS**

As the headteacher of Sacriston Academy, the safety and well-being of our students is my top priority. With this in mind, I am writing to inform you of an important change in our school policy regarding food safety.

Effective immediately, Sacriston Academy and all schools across the North East Learning Trust will be adopting a strict nut-free policy. This decision has been made in light of recent incidents and increasing concerns regarding students with severe nut allergies. Nut allergies can be life-threatening, and the presence of nuts or nut products on school premises poses a significant risk to these students.

To ensure the safety and health of all our students, we kindly request that <u>no nuts or nut-containing</u> <u>products be brought into the school</u>. This includes snacks, lunch items, and any food used for classroom activities or school events.

We understand that this change may require some adjustments for your family, and we appreciate your cooperation and support in helping us maintain a safe environment for all students. Please carefully check the labels of food products to ensure they are nut-free before sending them to school with your child.

Our school staff will be vigilant in monitoring this policy. However, we also rely on the support and understanding of our parent community to successfully implement these necessary precautions.

If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact the school office. We are here to support you and ensure that this transition is as smooth as possible for everyone.

# **Nursery Explore South Africa**

This week, Nursery have been learning about South Africa. The children were all very intrigued to learn about which animals live in Africa! #### Year 1 Ready, Set, Serve!

This half term Year 1 have been practicing their tennis skills in PE. In this week's lesson, Year 1 learned how to use a tennis racquet with control. First, the class practiced flipping a bean bag into the air and catching it, with some children also flipping their racquet to the other side as the bean bag travelled through the air. Next, they practiced in pairs using tennis racquets to pass the beanbag without dropping it and using the correct grip. At the end of the lesson, the class were challenged to pass the beanbag from one end of the class line to the other without dropping it. The class showed good concentration and teamwork skills to complete the task!



## Year 2 Learn all About Weight and Mass

Year 2 have been learning all about weight and mass, and have been using balancing scales to compare different classroom objects. They have demonstrated a keen enthusiasm for mathematical investigation and for exploring this new method of measuring.







#### **Year 3 Focus Learn About The Layers of the Earth**

This week year 3 have been focusing their learning on the layers of the Earth. This is a tricky topic as there is brand new, complex vocabulary to learn. They have used this knowledge to help in their leaflet writing in English and their work in Geography. Within Geography we have talked about plate tectonics and how different plate boundaries move. As well as this, we have discussed the career choices they could focus on if they are interested in this topic. Well done year 3 for working so hard!



### **Year 4 Water Cycle**

In their science lessons, Year 4 have been exploring the four stages of the water cycle. As part of this, we created our own mini versions of the water cycle and placed them on our classroom window. We watched how the heat from the sun changed the water in the bag into water vapour. This told us that evaporation and condensation had happened! We were also super surprised to discover that we use the same water as the dinosaurs!




# **Year 5 Minoan and Mycenaean Civilisations**


