Year 1 All About Our Country

This week in Geography, Year 1 have been learning about physical features that can be found in the United Kingdom. They learned that physical features are parts of our country that cannot be made by humans including rivers, mountains and coastlines. The class were excellent at identifying physical features and spotting those that were made by people instead, such as houses! They also learned about examples of these features, such as Ben Nevis, and were able to use their knowledge from previous lessons to locate which country of the United Kingdom they are in.


