For Maths this week, we will be learning about angles which we started learning about before school closed. On this webpage (link above), you will see four different tabs, which indicate Week 1, Week 2, Summer Week 1 and Summer Week 2. Please click on Summer Term Week 2 (the first lesson should be named: angles in special quadrilaterals). Once you click on this, it will show you 4 different lessons, for each day of this week, with a special challenge on a Friday.

Underneath the title, you will find a video which demonstrates the learning of the lesson, breaking down the understanding. Please pause and repeat this as needed. If you would like to write notes down during the video, please do. Once you have watched the video, please click on the 'Get the activity' section. This will then take you to a variety of different lessons based on the learning in the video. If you have access to a printer, you could print this off, however, alternatively, you could load up the document and work within your workbook to find the answers. After this, you have access to the answers, so you can mark your own work.

If you are finding it tricky, you can revise some more basic angles work by completing Summer Term: week 1 first which should be in the tab above on the website. It works in the same way with videos and tasks.



Science



Our new Science topic is evolution and inheritance. We had already started discussing some elements of evolution when learning how animals had adapted to living in The Arctic and Antarctica as part of our Frozen Kingdoms topic. I would like you to revise this by completing a writing project on Purple Mash. I have set a range of 2Dos which require to you to write an information text about adaption. I have set 5

different ones and you need to complete at least one. You can choose from adaptation to: deserts; woodland; oceans; tundra or mountains.
