"I am happy I am different."



Reception Butterfly Cycle

This week Reception have been learning all about the butterfly life cycle in their new topic 'Watch them grow'. We worked through 4 stages as the children started as the egg, then the caterpillar, they created cocoons and then fluttered around like butterflies. Year 1 Precious Items in RE

This week Year 1 began to learn about Judaism in RE, thinking about the question 'What is precious to Jewish people?'. Finally, they created their own mezuzahs, which are hung above doorways to Jewish homes.

Year 2 Learn All About Buddhism


Year 5 Make Parachutes!

This week, in Science, Year 5 made parachutes. We were testing different sized parachutes and how long they took to fall to the ground. We found the bigger the parachute, the more time it took to fall to the floor. This was due to it having a larger surface area which lead to more air resistance.



Year 6's Narrative Writing Cycle

Year 6 have spent several weeks on a narrative writing cycle. They used a video called 'Lighthouse' to write in role as a light housekeeper. In the narrative, the lighthouse breaks! Children then switched perspective and wrote in role as somebody on a ship who was struggling due to the choppy seas. Children worked hard to build a tense atmosphere and use punctuation such as semi colons and colons. Children in Year 6 should be very proud of the quality of work which they have produced!


