# OUTSTANDING EARLY YEARS

**Sorry about the mess, but we're learning here! Education for our youngest Sacriston Stars takes place in a completely unique world of colour, creativity and curiosity... where you might even come out covered in mud - welcome to early years!**

We are incredibly proud of the one-of-a-kind Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) kingdom we have created and the impact it has on our children. We know that children here are getting an early years education that's amongst the very best in the country.


We have exceptional facilities including an outdoor area, a make and create area, messy play, a finger gym, writing and maths areas, role play zones, an exploration station, construct and create zones and a real-life maths area. In October 2021, Ofsted rated our EYFS provision as 'outstanding'.

These innovative learning environments allow children a quiet space and safe areas to develop independence.

Our ambitious vocabulary approach includes 'weekly wondrous words' that introduces children to a high-level vocabulary in context that is used and practised throughout the week. Children as young as three retain the words and use them in their everyday play and experiences.

Our outside areas support development of all physical needs where children are challenged daily, leading to rapid progress.

Fine motor skills are honed through activities including 'dough disco' and our fundamental movement programme uses targeted and progressive intervention based on proven research.


# HOW TO APPLY

NELT is widely regarded as providing some of the best education in the county, and indeed the country, with children making significant progress from their starting points, achieving impressive exam results, and going on to access a range of well-respected further and higher education opportunities.

NELT has grown to 13 schools with an impressive series of rapid school improvements under their belts.
