YEAR 2

YEAR 3

This week, in Science, Year 3 have began their topic all about Rocks. To begin with, we were given different types of rocks such as sandstone, limestone and basalt and asked to classify these. We then learned about three different types of rocks (igneous, metamorphic and sedimentary) and classified our rocks again.





YEAR 4

This week, Year 4 began their fascinating new Science topic: *Animals Including Humans*. We explored the main parts of the digestive system and discovered how each one helps our bodies break down and move food. To help us understand the journey food takes, we carried out a fun experiment using tights to represent the intestines! We acted as teeth to break up the food, then watched what happens when it reaches the stomach and travels through the body.

YEAR 5

Year 5 have made a fantastic start to the new half term and have been enjoying some exciting new maths topics. We have explored lots of new mathematical vocabulary including multiples, factors, prime numbers, square numbers and cube numbers. We have used resources such as counters and cubes to help us determine whether a number is square or cube.

YEAR 6

This week, Year 6 started their new science topic all about electricity. They explored how changing the voltage in a circuit affects the brightness of a bulb, using their prior knowledge to make predictions. Working like real scientists, they designed and carried out their own investigation to test their ideas.
