### YEAR 1

Year 1's topic this half term in Design Technology is 'Our Food'. This half term the children have been learning the importance of handwashing and eating their 5 a day. The children have been learning how to use a range of tools to chop, grate, peel and mash fruits and vegetables.

### YEAR 5

Year have been working extremely hard in their Maths so far this half term. They have now completed their first module on Place Value and have now begun Addition and Subtraction. The children have worked together in pairs to help each other with rounding numbers up to the nearest 10, 100, 1000, 10000 and 100,000 as they worked to complete increasingly challenging and complex word problems.

### YEAR 6

This week, Year 6 were scientists by designing and carrying out an investigation to explore how exercise affects our heart rate. Using their prior knowledge, they predicted what might happen and tested it through a range of physical activities. They discovered that the harder the exercise, the higher the heart rate because muscles need more energy, so the heart pumps faster to deliver more oxygen-rich blood.
