# **Nursery Enjoy their Reading!**

This week in Nursery, the children have thoroughly enjoyed reading 'Mole' by Wildlife Watchers. We delved deeper into where moles live, what they eat and how molehills are formed. The children have collaged their own mole using different materials, created vibrations using the drums and fed the worms to make sure they are big enough to fill the moles tummies!









# **Reception 'Habitats Around the World'**

Reception have been watching videos from around the world and where animals live. Then the children sorted the animals into different habitats, and we talked about why these animals live in certain places.

# **Year 1 Studying the Senses**

This half term Year 1 have loved learning about their senses in Science, focusing on a different sense each week. Last week the class conducted a taste test and learned about the 4 different types of taste (salty, sweet, bitter and sour). They even learned about which part of the tongue experiences each type of taste. This week was all about hearing, and the class put their hearing skills to the test with a game of 'identify the sound' bingo. The class were fantastic at identifying the sounds and learned about how sounds are created by vibrations in the air around them.





# Year 2 'We Eat Elephants'








### Year 4 Use their Archaeological Skills!
