NURSERY EXPLORE BRAZIL!

This week, Nursery have delved deeper into their exploring! They have been learning all about Brazil, the children have loved learning about another country and seeing some of the traditions that the people of Brazil follow. We made some carnival masks and binoculars. The children enjoyed creating and using these during their masks and binoculars.





RECEPTION

This week Reception have been learning all about different types of dinosaurs. The children can tell the differences between an herbivore and a carnivore:

Laura "A carnivore is a meat eater like a T-Rex. An herbivore eats leaves like a diplodocus"

Abigail "If it eats meat it has sharp claws and teeth. If it eats plants it has grinding, flat teeth"

The children sorted the dinosaurs based on what they eat.





YEAR 1

In Maths, Year 1 have been developing a greater understanding of numbers to 20 by finding 1 more and 1 less. They have then used vocabulary of more than, greater than, less than and fewer than to compare numbers. The children have also started to develop an understanding of the symbols- < and >. Some great explanations have been produced using the correct vocabulary!





YEAR 2

The children in Year 2 have begun an exciting new Geography topic entitled 'Our Wonderful World', which sees them learn all about the continents, oceans, climates and countries of planet Earth. This week, the children discovered the seven continents were Europe, Asia, North America, South America, Africa, Australasia and Antarctica. They made their very own maps of the continents on paper plates to be displayed in our classroom. Great work, Year 2!





YEAR 3

This week in Maths, Year 3 have began their new length topic. In their first lesson, the children were tasked with measuring different objects around the classroom using metre sticks and rulers, having to choose which unit of measurement they thought was the most appropriate depending on the

object.





YEAR 4

This week, Year 4 started to explore making simple circuits in their science lessons. We discovered that we only need a bulb, cell and two wires to ensure the bulb lights up. After experimenting with the components, we drew our own circuits following Miss Jackson's challenges. For example, we drew circuits with more than one bulb and circuits using a buzzer! Year 4 were excellent at working together to create different circuits. We even discovered that we conduct electricity!








YEAR 5

Year 5 have completed a science lesson based on levers. The children were given three pieces of equipment (a ruler, a pencil and a rubber) to experiment how they could create a lever. We learnt that the pencil was used as a fulcrum and a rubber was used as a load. After we learnt how to successfully make the lever, we experimented with different loads, before drawing a diagram to represent this in our science books.







YEAR 6

This week, we have looked at how Britain's Home Front coped when they were under attack during WW2. We looked at what a blackout was, what measures people took to achieve them and the use of air raid shelters during the Blitz. We even carried out our very own blackout too (so well that you can't even see us!).
