Year 2 have been using their new knowledge of coastline features to sort images into categories of 'human' and 'physical' features. We worked in groups then shared our findings with the class.








## **Year 3 'Emperors and Empires'**

This week, Year 4 have started reading their new class text, Secrets of a Sun King, which links to our history topic Ancient Civilisations. We started the week by making predictions and wowing Miss Jackson with the knowledge we already have about Ancient Egypt. We looked at key vocabulary and explored different artefacts from Ancient Egypt such as sarcophaguses, canopic jars and pharaohs. Next week, we are excited to start writing our own stories linked to Ancient Egypt!




# Year 5 Living Things and their Habitats!
