Maths



Practice your fractions by playing Fractonio's Pizzeria on purple mash. I have set it as a 'To Do' for you. Remember to read the fraction very carefully! The numerator (the number on the top of the fraction) tells you how many parts of the denominator (the number on the bottom of the fraction) which is how many parts there are altogether. For example, ¼ is 1 out of the 4 equal parts.

Once you have done this, draw some pizzas in your book and write what fraction of toppings there are. Just like this one –

½ cheese

1/4 peperoni

1/4 mushroom



Remember, ½ is the same as 2/4.

Reading and writing




On Purple Mash I have set you a To Do called 'Book dictionary'. Please read a book at home, it could be
