We began by recapping what we already knew about Romans before learning more about Roman settlements in Britain. We were then able to handle some Roman artefacts, as well as transcribe the Lanchester diploma and design our own Roman coins.



Year 3 also embarked on a school trip to Binchester Roman Fort to finish off our topic of Romans. We began the day by being given a tour of the fort by Sophie and Mark. We were shown Dere Street, the Commander's House and the Commander's Bath house. We then completed activities involving creating mosaics and handling Roman artefacts. After lunch, we were shown the Regimental bath house before making our own Roman clay pots to take home. What a wonderful day!

This week, Year 4 had an exciting visitor from the Oriental Museum to teach us all about Vikings. We started the day by becoming archaeologists and exploring some ancient artefacts from the Viking period. We used our archaeologist skills to discover what each item was, what it was made of and what it was used for. We looked at a Viking horn, small sculptures, flint, cloth and even a Viking sword! We were surprised that the Vikings used to play board games! After this, we looked at the Norse language used by Vikings and learned that a lot of our words came from this. We created our own Viking names and carved it onto paper just like the Vikings would carve into stone. We had an excellent day, thank you Oriental Museum!
